Child Nutrition Services is dedicated to providing safe, nutritious food to students, carefully following food preparation guidelines and monitoring sanitation procedures. The Child Nutrition team consists of 95 food and nutrition professionals who are dedicated to students' health, well-being and their ability to learn. Of those, seven are Food Service Supervisors, four Support staff, and 1 Child Nutrition Assistant Director.

The facts below encompass the Child Nutrition Department:

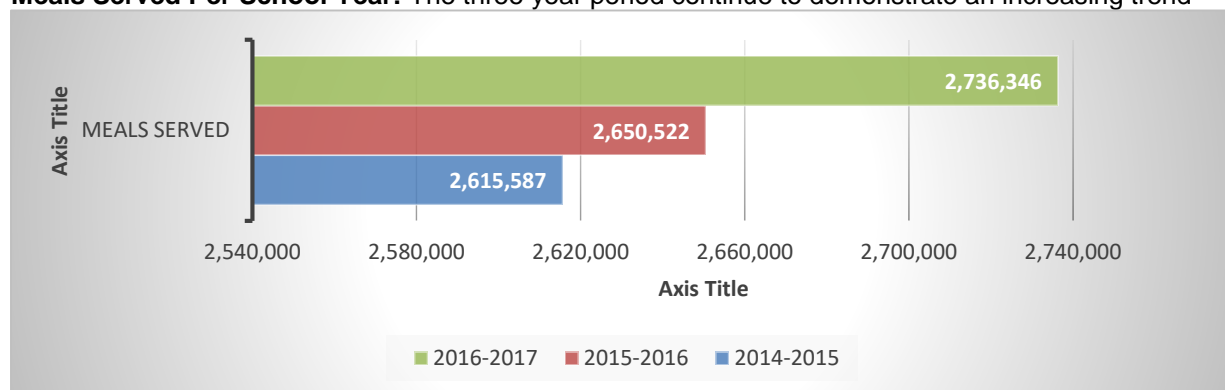
Programs Operated: National School Lunch Program and Breakfast Program, Summer Food Service Program, and Child and Adult Care Food Program (Supper Program).

Number of Menu Items: Elementary School sites all have a choice of 2 entrée options and self-serve salad bar which contains fresh fruits and vegetables. The secondary schools have a choice of 4 entrees daily. Secondary sites also have Ala Carte food items for purchase. All schools have a daily vegetarian option. All foods served and sold on school grounds within the school day meet federal nutritional regulations. Upon submission of "Medical Statements", Child Nutrition services has appropriate food substitutions to accommodate food allergies or intolerances.

Purchasing Cooperation Groups: Child Nutrition Services follows stringent procurement processes. All commercial food and paper products (paper goods, chemicals, refrigerated, frozen, dairy and milk, produce, canned and dry, bread) are put out to Bid through the San Joaquin Purchasing Cooperation (SJVP). Currently, the SJVP is composed of over 25 school districts.

All of the USDA Commodity foods at Sanger Unified are put out to Bid through the Super Co-op. Sanger Unified USDA Commodity food ordering, processing, and food diversion designations are conducted through the Super Co-Op.

Meals Served Per School Year: The three year period continue to demonstrate an increasing trend



For SY 2016/2017 a total of 953,226 breakfast, 1,437,737 lunches, 282,381 snacks were served. 63,002 Suppers ("Super Snacks") were served through the Child and Adult Care Food Program.

Participation, Meal Average per Day: Breakfast 5,296, Lunch 7,758.
